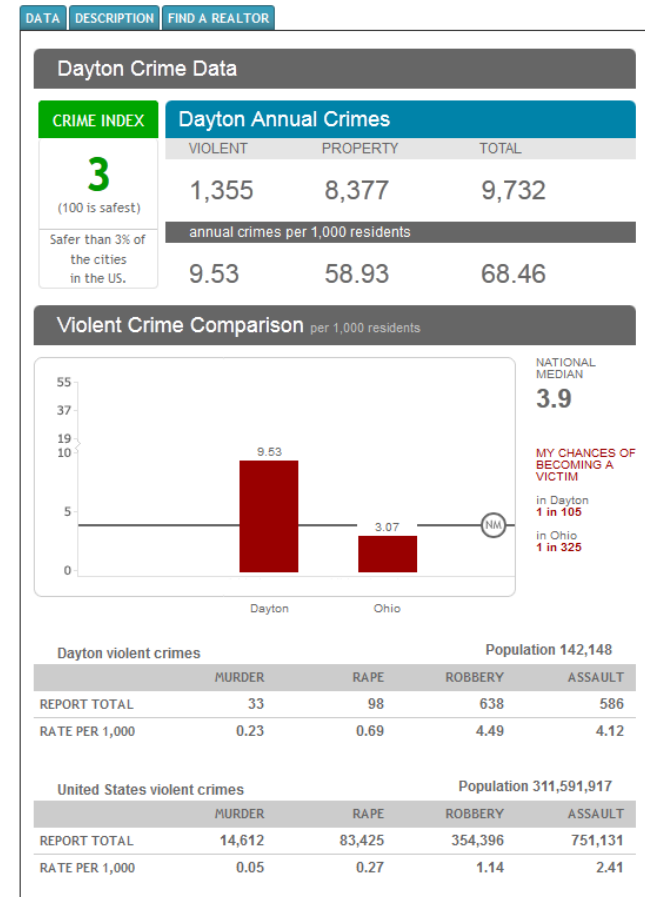

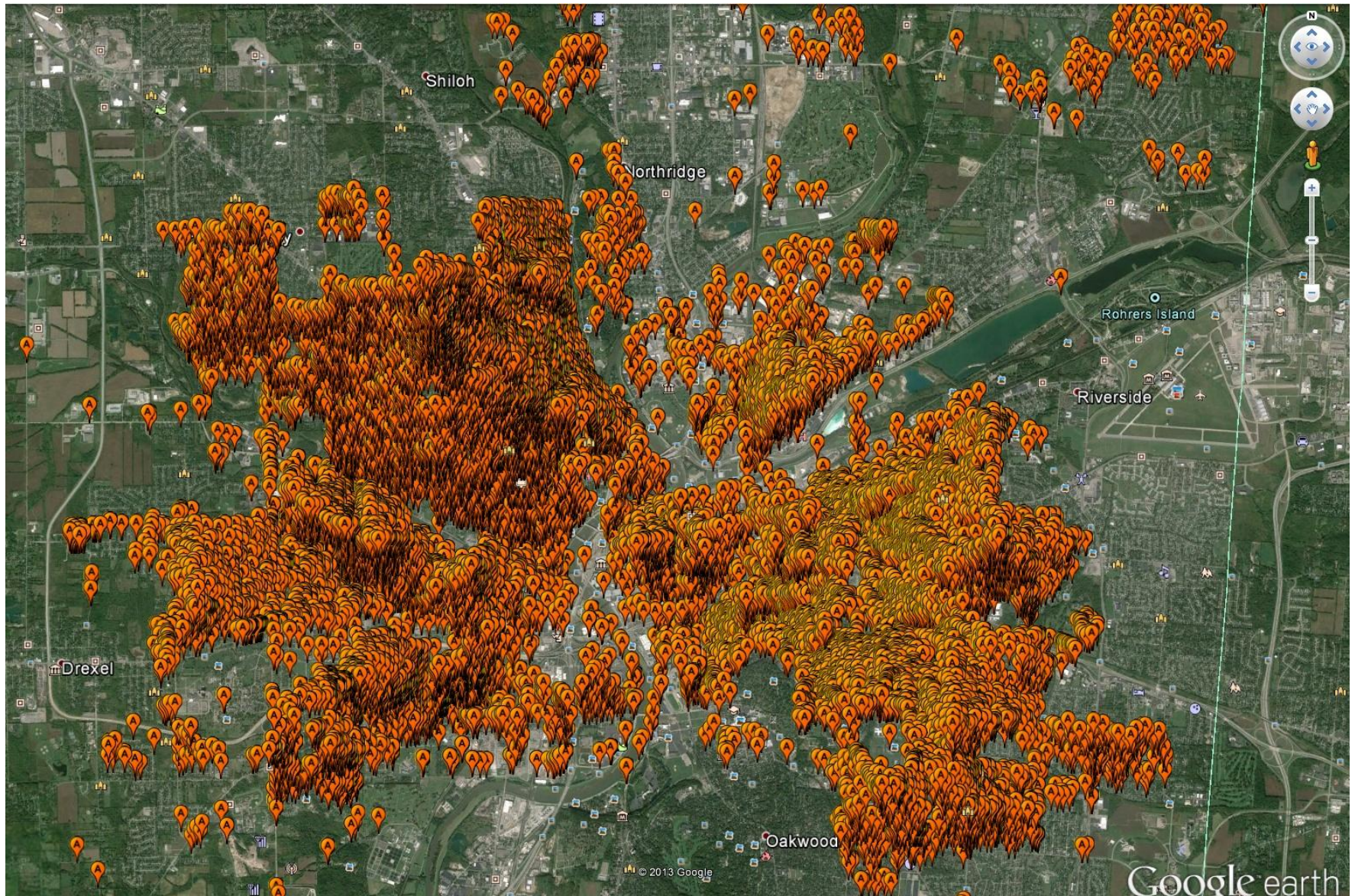

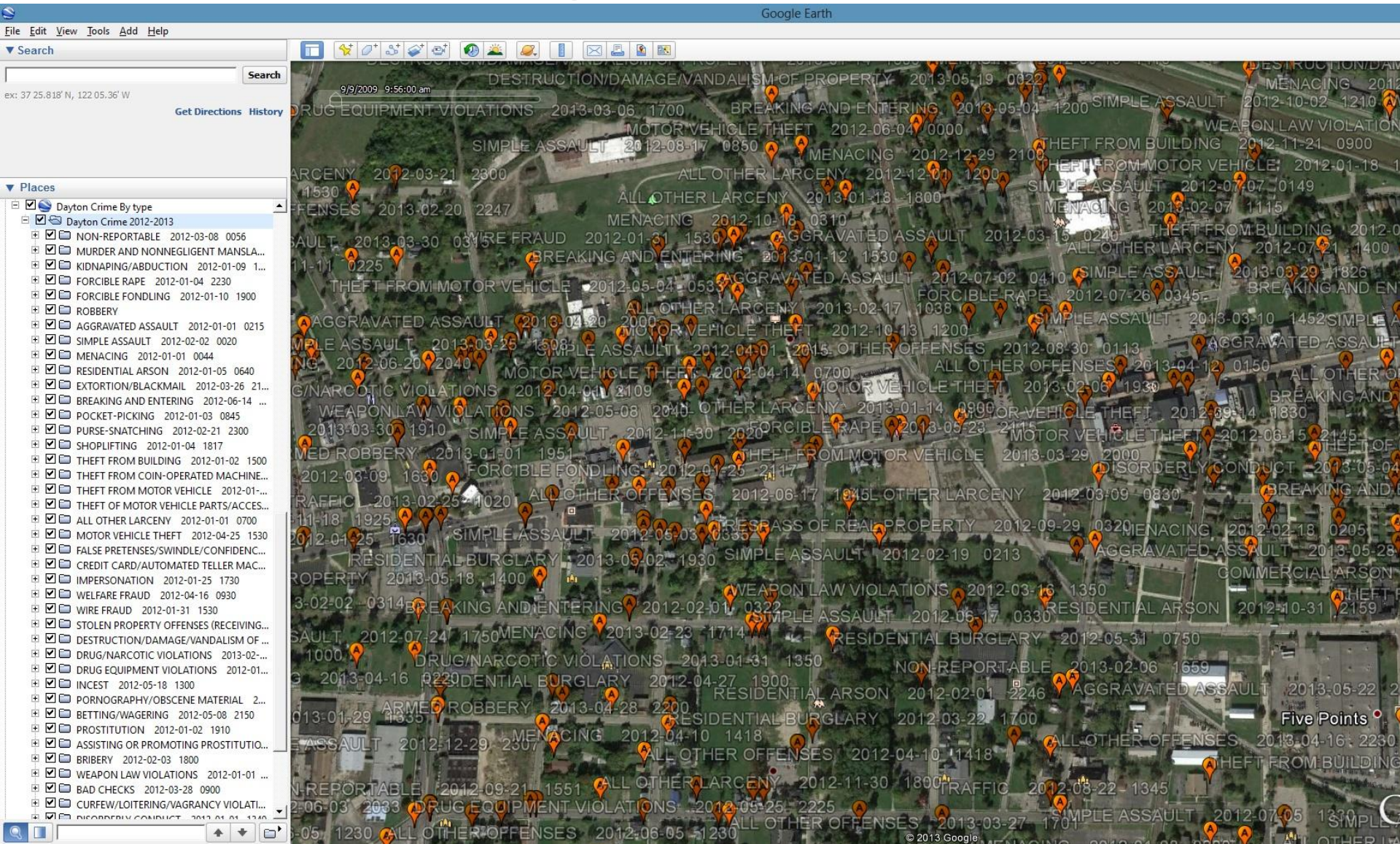

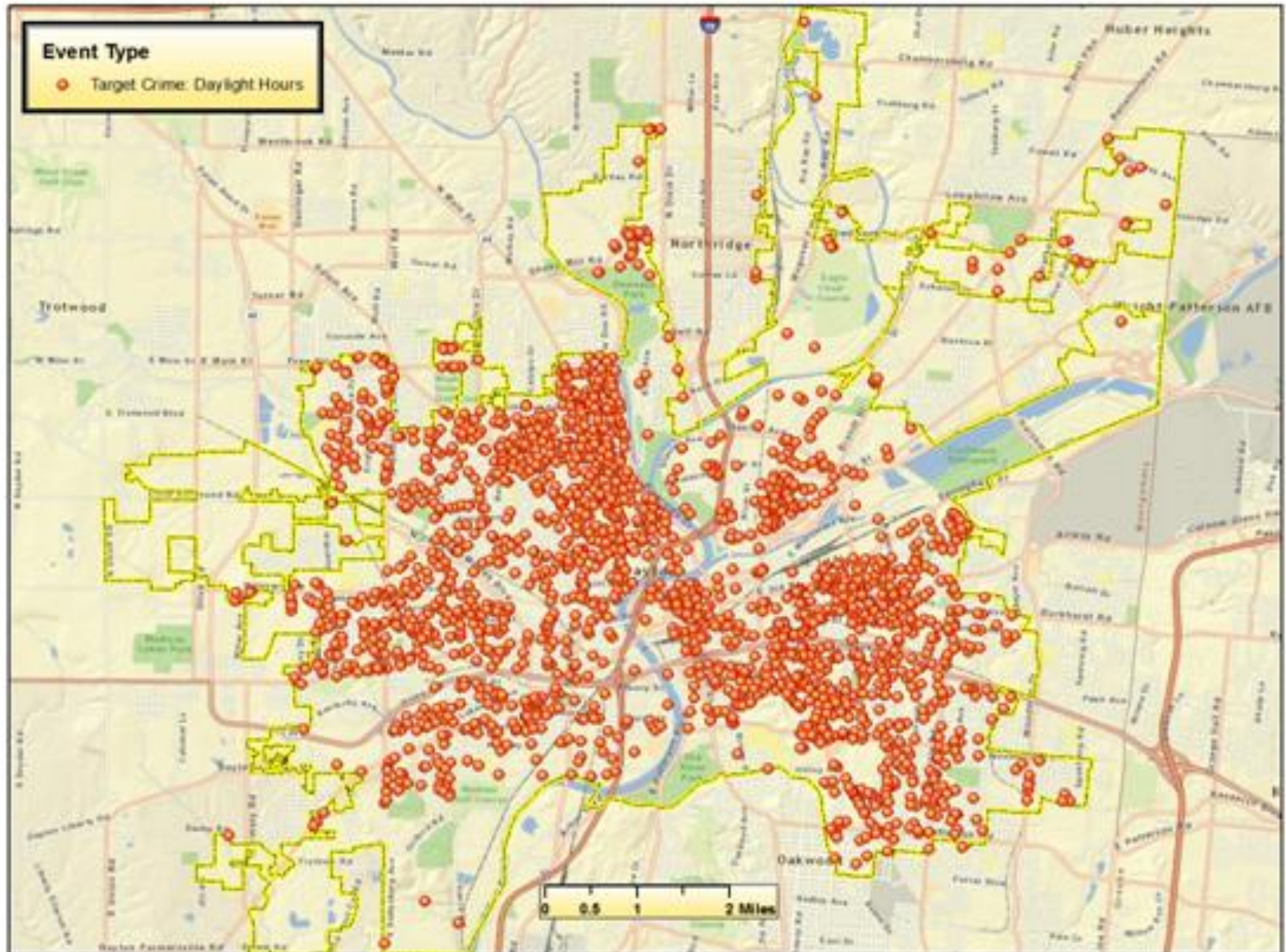

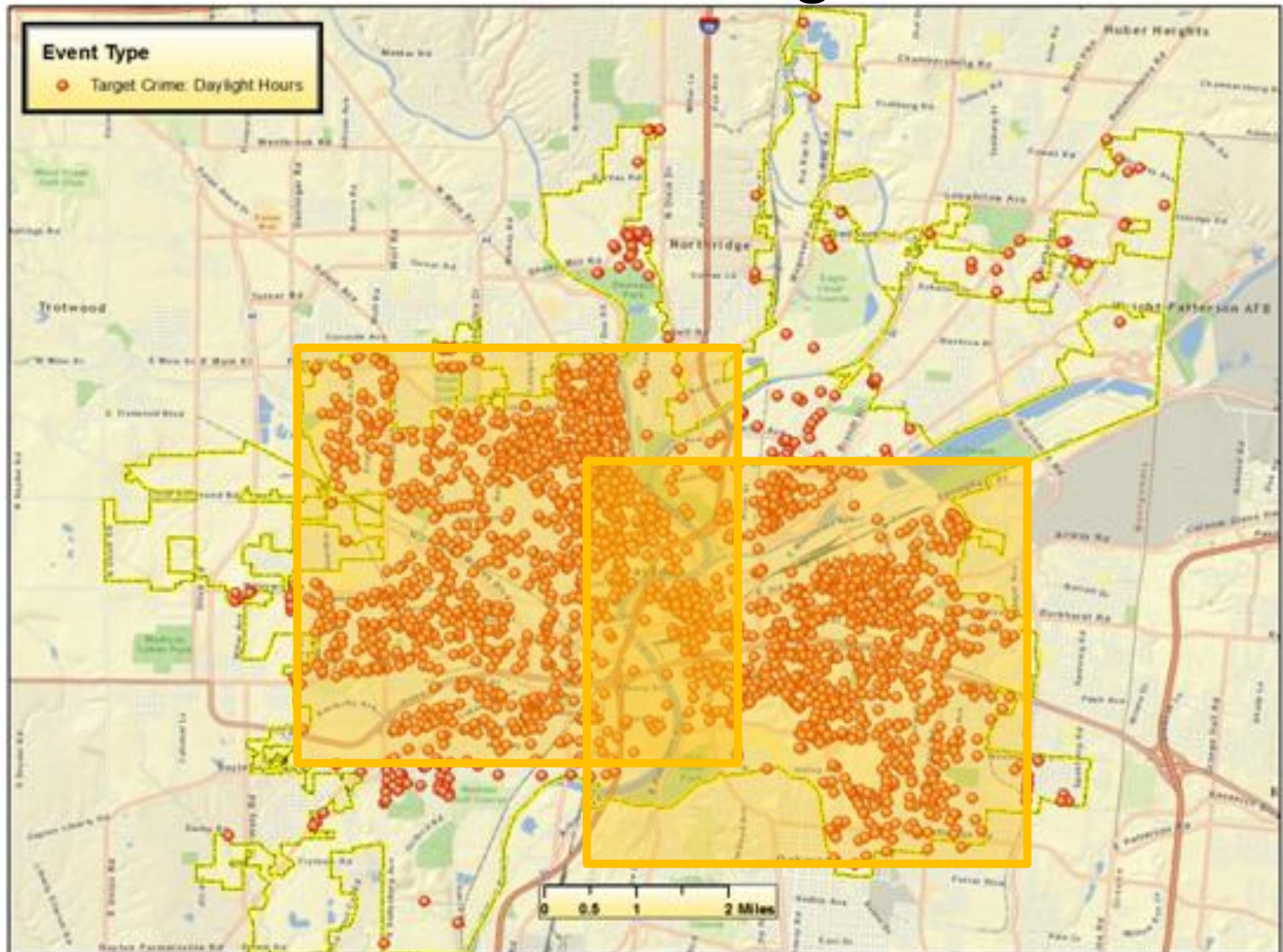
Dayton Crime at the Neighborhood level

Dayton Crime Daylight Hours with PSS Coverage Areas























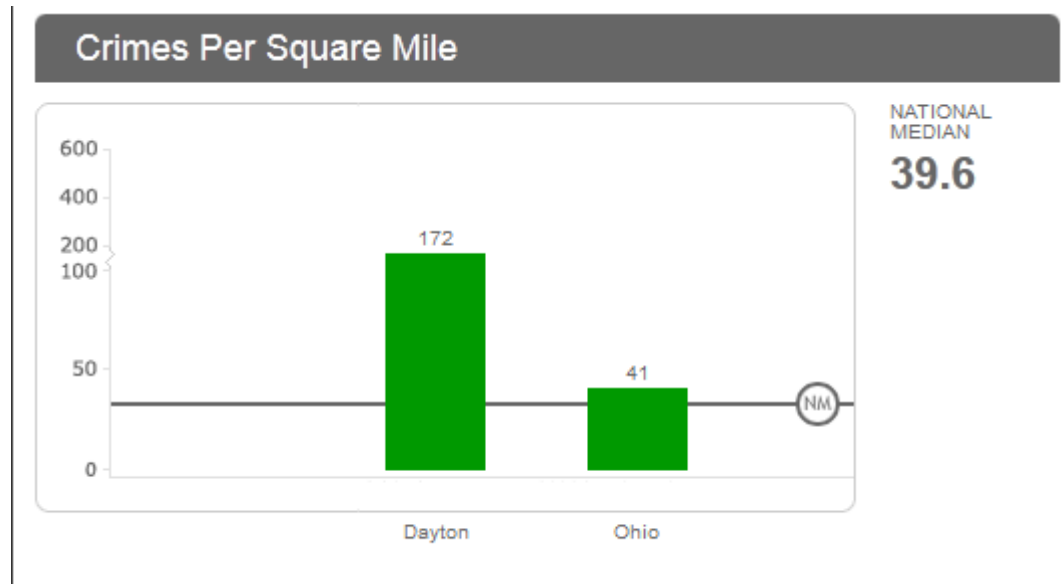

The cost of crime is significant. The national Institute of Justice has sponsored many studies on the cost of crime to a community. Using the results of one of these studies conducted by the Rand Center on Quality Policing the cost of crime in Dayton is calculated to be \$480M per year. This is calculated by multiplying the number of crimes in a given category by the cost of crime from the study.

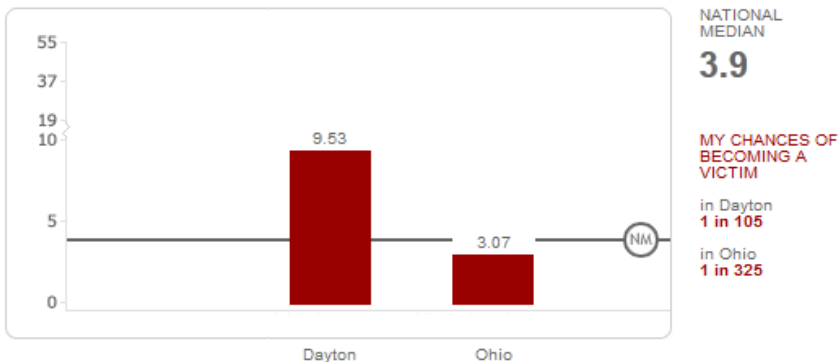

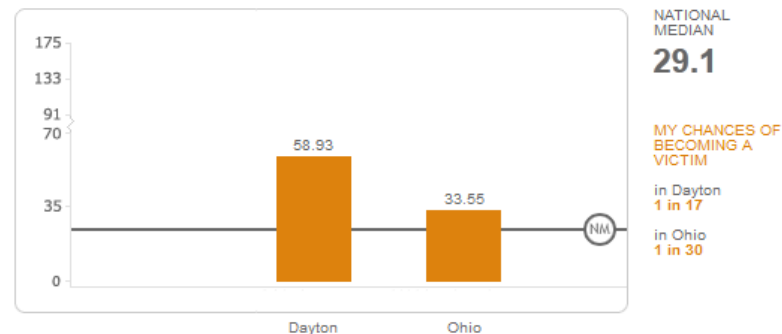

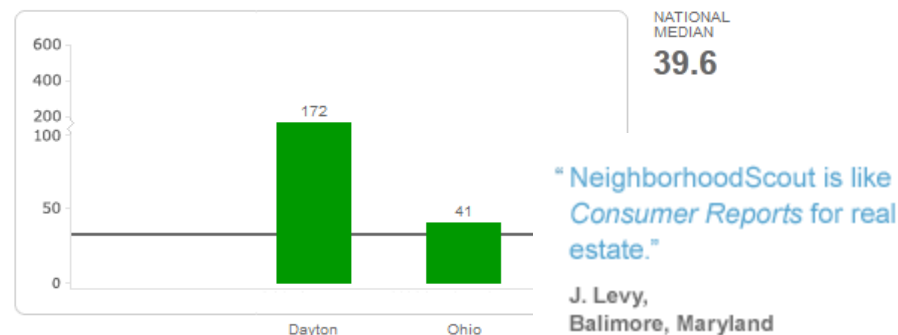

- The crime data that NeighborhoodScout used for this analysis are the seven offenses from the uniform crime reports, collected by the FBI from 17,000 local law enforcement agencies, and include both violent and property crimes, combined.
- Now let us turn to take a look at how Dayton does for violent crimes specifically, and then how it does for property crimes. This is important because the overall crime rate can be further illuminated by understanding if violent crime or property crimes (or both) are the major contributors to the general rate of crime in Dayton.
- For Dayton, we found that the violent crime rate is one of the highest in the nation, across communities of all sizes (both large and small). Violent offenses tracked included forcible rape, murder and non-negligent manslaughter, armed robbery, and aggravated assault, including assault with a deadly weapon. According to NeighborhoodScout's analysis of FBI reported crime data, your chance of becoming a victim of one of these crimes in Dayton is one in 105.

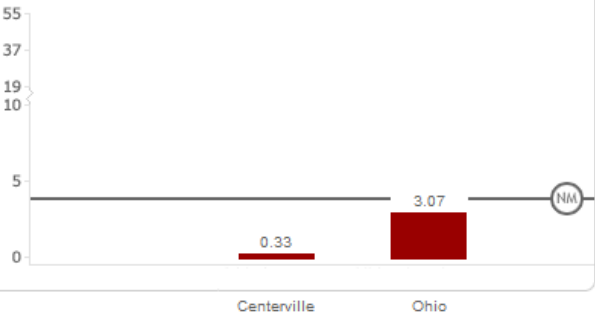

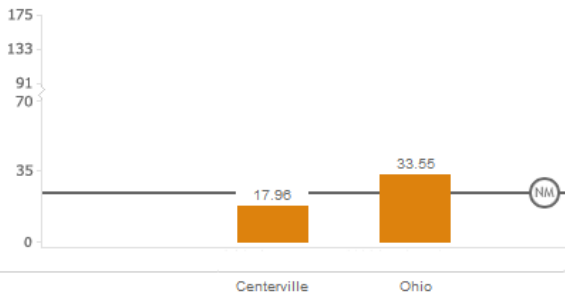

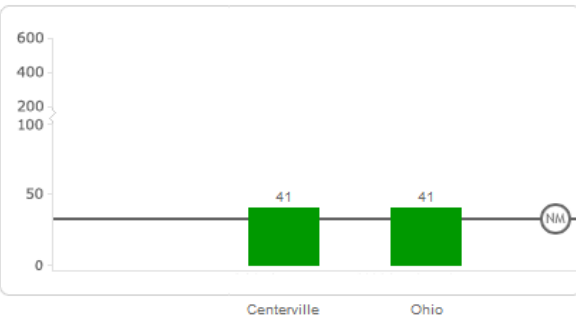
