






Dayton Crime at the Neighborhood level



Using the results of one of these studies conducted by the Rand Center on Quality Policing the cost of crime in Dayton is calculated to be \$480M per year. This is calculated by multiplying the number of crimes in a given category by the cost of crime from the study.
